



Immunizations



Here are questions I get regarding immunizations:

1. Does my child need a vaccination?

Answer: Bring your child's record to New Stanley and I will be happy to review it with you. You can also access the links below to check.

Birth to 6 years old

2. What if my child is behind on the vaccination schedule?

Answer: Vaccinations are important and a late vaccination is better than no vaccination. There is a catch up schedule that your physician will follow. You can access the link below to look at the catch up schedule.

3. Will my child be excluded from school until all vaccinations are brought up to date?

Answer: No. Your child may attend school as long as the first missed vaccinations have been administered. You must stay on schedule for the following catch up vaccinations. If you fail to do this, your child could be dismissed until the next set has been given.

4. I have lost my child's immunization record. Is there a way that the school nurse can access my child's Kansas immunization records for me?

Answer: Yes! If I have a WebIZ consent form signed by you, I can pull up your child's Kansas immunizations. You may have signed one that was in the kindergarten enrollment packet. If not, you can come to New Stanley and sign one or call me and I can send one home with your child. 913-627-3977
